The first team were Inksplash who created Christmas Cards of local scenes enhanced with AI technology to give them a Christmas look and feel. The second team were Books N' Brews who created a 'blind date with a book'.

The teams represented Berwickshire High School in a mature manner and showed off how hard they had worked through taking part in an interview and a presentation in front of a panel of judges. The event was a great success with judges commenting on how well both teams had created and developed their businesses. The night concluded with the prize giving, with Books N' Brews taking the majority of the awards. They won 6/9 awards which included:


Puzzle of the Month
