- 1. Ask yourself: What do I want them to learn?

 - · It's not as stupid a question as it may look!
 · What knowledge am I trying to impart?
- 2. Put that into words.
 - · If it helps, u words like "know...", "understand...", "Develop your understanding of...", "Be able to..."
- 3.Look at what you've written. Ask yourself:
 - · Is it a task/a thing to do? If so, "reframe" it.
 - · Can it be measured proven? Great! How? Well, now we're talking Success CRITERIA!
