## What is Retrieval Practice?

There was a discussion around the idea of retrieval practice and any misconceptions relating to it.

Retrieval practice is the act of consistently accessing stored information in the long-term memory, transfer it into the working memory and thus, strengthening recall in the future.

## Misconceptions:

Retrieval practice is **NOT** time consuming and should not only be completed when you have time. Retrieval practice is happening more often than you might think.

This practice **DOES NOT** always need to be written down and can be transferred into a practical setting.

- Keyword Spotlight

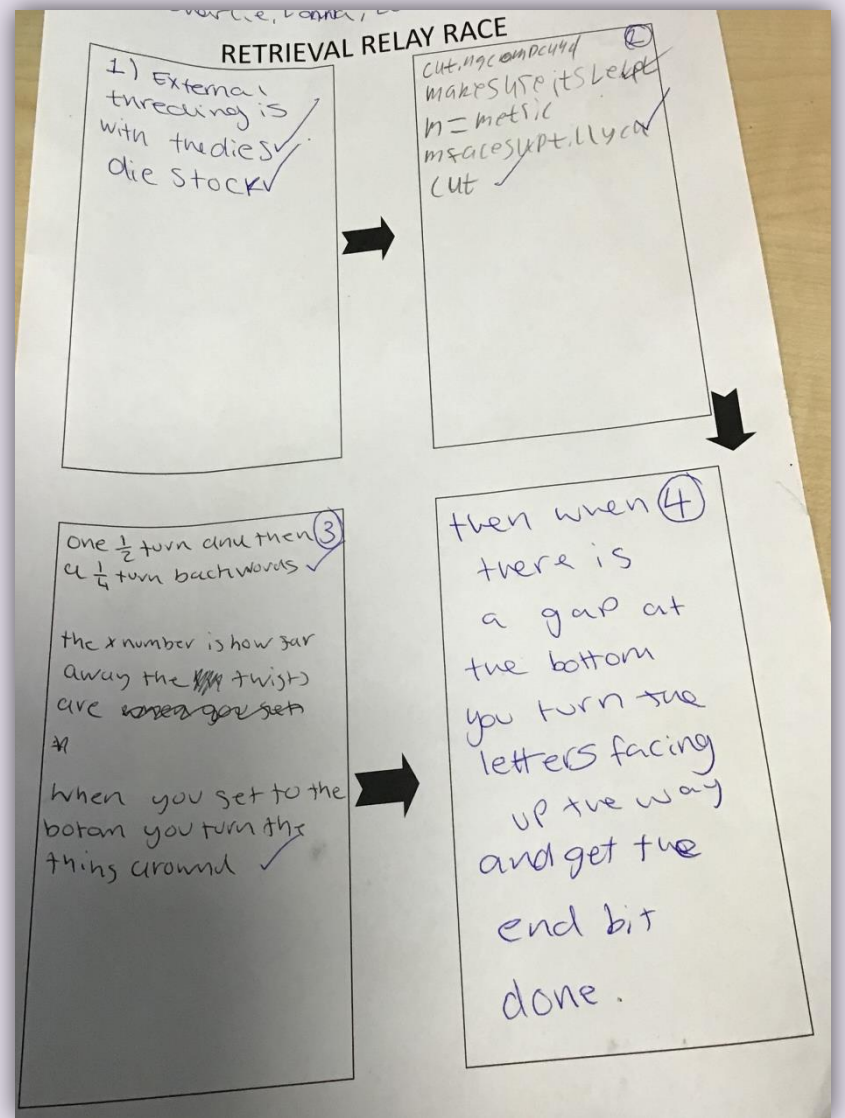
For four weeks we all went away and trialled out these different tools to see what worked and what did not and discussed the effects. These can be seen on the next page.

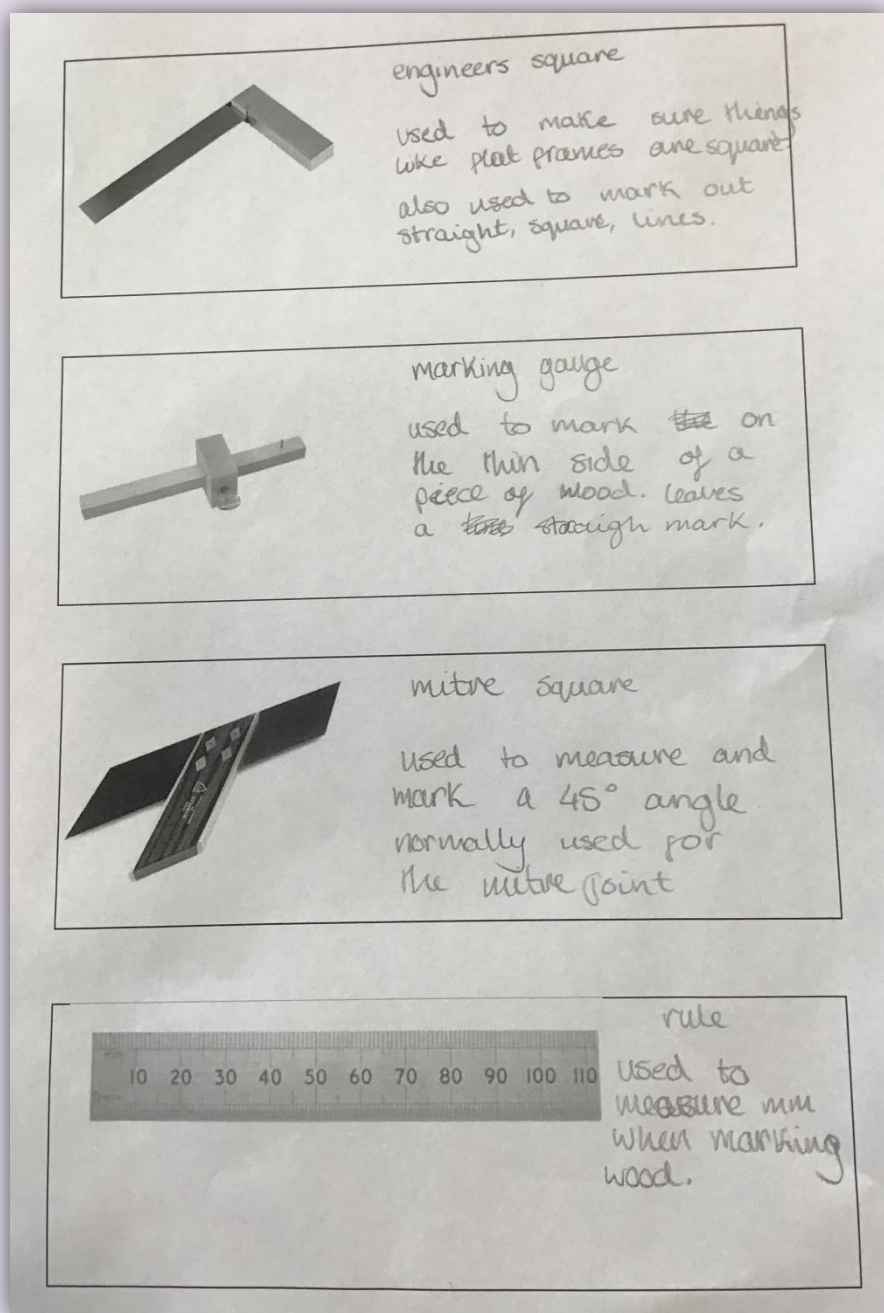
## Examples of Retrieval Practice:

<p>If this is the answer, what is the question? How many points can you get in 10 minutes?</p>		
If there are no chance for the patients survival e.g., brain-stem death	This type has less moral issues because the donor has given permission	This type of organ donation does not effect the sanctity of life belief
It raises issues as the heart needs to be beating when removed	It goes against the will of God as God might see that it was the time for the person to die.	Part of the liver, kidney, bone marrow
the process of removing an organ from one person and implanting it in another.	This Bible verse seems to state that it is a sin to pass 'life' or blood from one body to another	This is a form of agape love and links to examples from Jesus' actions.

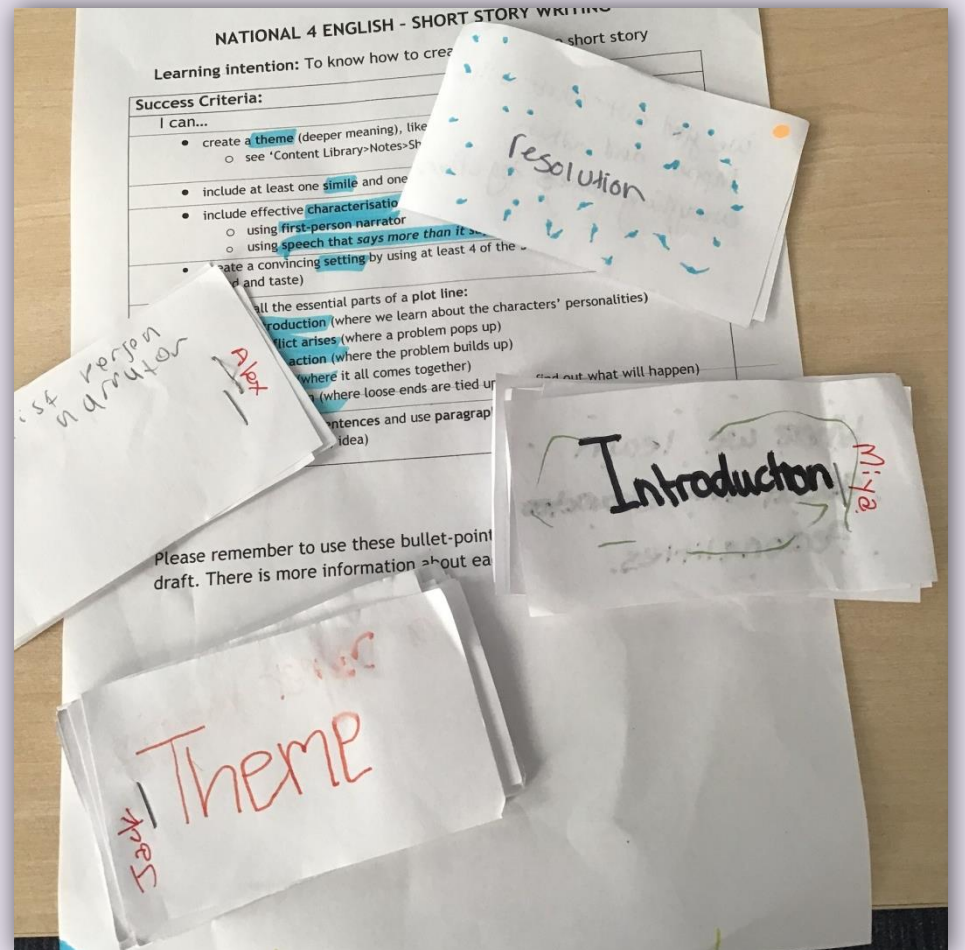
## Retrieval Grid - RMPS
