What is Retrieval Practice?

There was a discussion around the idea of retrieval practice and any misconceptions relating to it.

Retrieval practice is the act of consistently accessing stored information in the long-term memory, transfer it into the working memory and thus, strengthening recall in the future.

Misconceptions:

Retrieval practice is **NOT** time consuming and should not only be completed when you have time. Retrieval practice is happening more often than you might think.

This practice **DOES NOT** always need to be written down and can be transferred into a practical setting.


As a group we looked at different methods of retrieval practice and how they could be used within our subjects:

- Keyword Spotlight


For four weeks we all went away and trialled out these different tools to see what worked and what did not and discussed the effects. These can be seen on the next page.




Retrieval Grid - RMPS



Picture Prompt - CDT




Retrieval Race - CDT


